One: God be in our heads, and in our understanding: (touch fingers to head)

God be in our eyes, and in our looking (touch fingers to eyes)

God be in our mouths, and in our speaking; (touch fingers to mouth) God be in our hearts, and in our thinking; (touch fingers to heart) God be at our end, and at our departing. (hands fall to sides)

All: Amen.

Collect

(A member of the community lights the candle.)

One: God of life,

in whom we live and move and have our being,

you are our source and our ending. We come together in love to sing, to reflect, to pray and to celebrate the life of your Spirit among us

Be with us today. Guide and inspire us

that we may reflect your light to all the world.

All: Amen.

We Reflect

Meditation

(15 minute silent meditation)

Assurance

One: God's love and the Spirit's life are constant,

Yet human beings are imperfect.

Sometimes we feel lost;

sometimes we struggle with uncertainty.

We may not know what we need or how to ask for it.

We may not know how to give or receive help.

At times we may know the path we should take yet fail to follow it.

Let us remember that God is the source of compassion.
In all of life's struggles,
God knows us, loves us, forgives us and welcomes us home.
God *is* love.
We are not alone.

All: Thanks be to God.

Sung response

Lectio divina

While a passage from the Bible is read, we each listen for words, images and associations that the text triggers for us. After a time of silence, the passage is read again. Everyone is then invited to share their reflections on the text if they choose to do so. We conclude with a final reading of the text.

We Offer

Prayers of Thanksgiving

One: Let us name aloud the joys and celebrations of our lives. (Everyone is invited to name spontaneously events, circumstances, people and things for which they give thanks.)

One: God of love,

You are the source of everything that is good, affirming, healing, nurturing and life-giving. We thank you for the beauty of this world, for the wonder of life and for the mystery of love. We thank you for the blessing of family and friends, for this community and for the loving care which surrounds us. We give thanks for Jesus who showed us the Way of healing, peace and reconciliation, his example of faithful non-violence and courageous non-attachment, even to life itself.

All: Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

(The prayers of the people are offered by a member of the community following which everyone is invited to light a candle and offer a prayer in silence or aloud.)

Music (response to the Prayers)

One: God of our life, there are days when the burdens we carry chafe our shoulders and weigh us down; when the road seems dreary and endless, the skies grey and threatening; when our lives have no music in them, and our hearts are lonely, and our souls have lost their courage. Flood the path with light, run our eyes to where the skies are full of promise; tune our hearts to brave music; give us the sense of comradeship with heroes and saints of every age; and so quicken our spirits that we may be able to encourage the souls of all who journey with us on the road of life, to your honour and glory.
